## CRITERIA FOR AWARDS

Colours are awarded for representing co-curricular areas of school life, recognising loyalty and dedication together with a major commitment and contribution to a co-curricular area. They should be a permanent recognition of an outstanding achievement. There are three types of school colours:

### Junior Colours



#### Awarded to 2nd Year pupils

*Covering commitment across the 1st & 2nd Year*

Junior Colours: Blue Lapel Badge

These should be awarded towards the end of the appropriate term in the 2nd Year and should be in recognition of:

- Sustained commitment, displaying loyalty and dedication
- The attainment of dedication to performance throughout the 1st & 2nd Year
- A positive attitude to playing and performing, as requested
- A positive role model and being an ambassador for Truro School

Pupils, who may have joined the school part way through the 1st – 2nd Year, who have made an outstanding contribution and demonstrated the criteria described above, may also be awarded Junior Colours, as decided by the department leader.

### Middle Colours



#### Awarded to 5th Year pupils

*Covering commitment across the 3rd, 4th & 5th Year*

Middle Colours: Silver Lapel Badge

These should be awarded towards the end of the appropriate term in the 5th Year and should be in recognition of:

- Sustained commitment, displaying loyalty and dedication
- The attainment of dedication to performance throughout the 3rd, 4th & 5th Year
- A positive attitude to playing and performing, as requested
- A positive role model and being an ambassador for Truro School

Pupils, who may have joined the school part way through the 4th – 5th Year, who have made an outstanding contribution and demonstrated the criteria described above, may also be awarded Middle School Colours, as decided by the department leader.

### Sixth Form Colours



#### Awarded to Upper Sixth Students

*Covering commitment across the Lower Sixth & Upper Sixth*

Senior Colours: Gold Lapel Badge

These should be awarded towards the end of the appropriate term in the Upper Sixth and should be in recognition of:

- Sustained commitment, displaying loyalty and dedication
- The attainment of dedication to performance throughout the Lower Sixth and Upper Sixth
- A positive attitude to playing and performing, as requested
- A positive role model and being an ambassador for Truro School
